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Professional Experience

Lynchburg Pulmonary and Associates – Nurse Practitioner -Autonomous **November 2016 to present (January 2022)**

- ❖ I was hired in 2016 as critical care/pulmonary/Sleep Medicine nurse practitioner. I see patients in both the inpatient and outpatient setting and am privileged at LGH where my duties include but are not limited to:
 - Making rounds on hospitalized adult patients in Acute care setting, Admissions/Discharges
 - Complete Pulmonary/Sleep Consultations as part of collaborative team
 - Perform Radiological exams and interpretation in real time (Ultrasound and Xray)
 - Perform Thoracentesis and percutaneous chest tube placement/removal
 - Placement/removal of Central lines/Dialysis catheters/Cooling Catheters
 - Assist with Bronchoscopies and Intubations
 - Suturing/stapling and minor surgical procedures
 - Management of COVID 19 patients, with focus on pulmonary.
- ❖ In the outpatient setting I see patients post discharge after hospitalization and as new patients for pulmonary consultation in office. My duties there include but are not limited to:
 - COPD clinic- I ran an 8 patient clinic weekly as part as readmission program with Centra Health. There the focus is to capture “at risk” patients with a pulmonary diagnosis in hospital and offer quick follow up and a focus on disease education, and optimization of treatment.
 - I perform radiologic exams including ultrasound and X-ray along with interpretation in real time. I spend a great deal of time viewing and interpreting CT/PET scan for diagnosis, staging, and coordinating treatment of various chest disease.
 - I perform in office procedures such as tracheostomy care and changes, thoracentesis, chest tube removal, Pleurx management.
 - I am able to admit to inpatient setting, refer to specialist, and order any necessary tests.
 - I have been trained to interpret pulmonary test results including: Pulmonary Function tests (simple spirometry and lung volumes/DLCO, methacholine challenge testing, FENO, 6MWT, cardiopulmonary exercise testing, and EKG).
 - Long term management of COVID 19 patients in the outpatient setting.
- ❖ Practice Administrator/Operation Management
 - In February of 2020 I was tasked with helping with our practice operations and am compensated for said duties. My duties include:
 - Hiring, evaluating, developing, coaching, and terminating office staff. I successfully hired an entire staff for our two medical offices during pandemic (front office, medical staff, back office) and was able to retain ALL employees hired until we could recruit and transition to a new practice manager in September 2021.
 - Managing and equitably resolving grievances amongst staff
 - Building and maintain sense of teamwork and engagement among the office staff
 - Conducting our “morning huddle” to coordinate clinic operations, learn from our experiences, and improve clinic operations
 - Other duties as assigned by our practice manager.
- ❖ Clinical Researcher/Site Coordinator
 - In January of 2018 I took over as Lead Study Coordinator for research at LPA. I am currently leading our IPF and ILD registries, which are investigative studies involving data collection and biorepository. I screen and consent trial candidates, performs blood draws, and process all specimens prior to shipping.

- I am involved in screening/selecting new potential studies/trials. We are actively enrollment for CHRONICAL study for asthma.
- ❖ Lecturing/mentoring at Liberty University for the Department of Nursing/University of Lynchburg
 - I have been guest lecturing in the DNP FNP program at LU. I have taught on subjects pertaining to my specialty in the Acute Care and Chronic disease graduate courses.
 - I have mentored numerous students as a preceptor in Masters and Doctorate level programs. I currently am working with 1 DNP/FNP students completing their practicums with me from Liberty University. And just finished precepting a PA student with University of Lynchburg
- ❖ Centra Health Leadership Council-Board of Directors
 - I have served as a voting member of the Centra Council for the board of directors since December of 2018. The Council is the committee of the Centra Board of Directors charged with governance of credentialing, physician relations, clinical quality, safety and patient satisfaction.
- ❖ Robert Carter Law-Legal Review expert
 - I have 2 years of experience working with personal injury lawyer where I was responsible for reviewing cases for merit, fact finding, composing summary for demand/settlement letters, compiling costs associated with the case, and making recommendations for expert witnesses. My experience as both a provider and bedside nurse was imperative in this role. I have completed over 20 cases to date.

- ❖ I served as a lead preceptor to new staff, competency validator to existing staff, NGB unit president, charge nurse, and was on the leadership counsel.
- ❖ Working in the Intensive Care setting as a RN I was responsible for the management of critically ill patients—often with a cardiac and/or surgical emphasis. My duties included but were not limited to:
 - Complete ventilator management to extubation in fresh cardiac surgery patients
 - Intra aortic balloon pump, transvenous, and temporary pace maker management; and assistance with bedside insertion
 - Initiation and maintenance of aquaphoresis therapy
 - Maintenance of bedside CRRT dialysis
 - Management of thermaguard/alsius cooling system and proficient in the care of post code patients
 - Interpretation of 12 lead EKG/ STEMI identification for all in house “chest pain calls”
 - Responsible for the mixing and titration of intravenous medications
 - Providing sedation/assisting in bedside procedures such as: cardioversions, bronchoscopies, insertion of central lines, intubation, and tracheotomies
 - LVAD management
 - Ekos catheter management
 - Trained to care for cardiac and thoracic surgery patients in the immediate post operative period (includes managing and interpreting PA catheter data, chest tubes, ventilation, temporary pacing, intravenous medications, etc)
