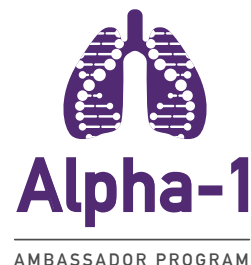

Be at the forefront of **alpha₁-antitrypsin deficiency detection and management.**

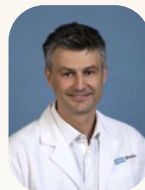
